This permit covering the well operator and well location shown above is evidence of permission granted to conduct activities in accordance with the Oil and Gas Act and the Oil and Gas Conservation Law, if the well is subject to that act and any rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, subject to the conditions contained herein and in accordance with the application submitted for this permit. This permit does not convey any property rights.

This permit and the permittee's authority to conduct the activities authorized by this permit are conditioned upon operator's compliance with applicable law and regulations.

Notification must be given to the district oil and gas inspector, the surface landowner and political subdivision of the date well drilling will begin at least 24 hours prior to commencement of drilling activities.

The permittee hereby authorizes and consents to allow, without delay, employees or agents of the Department to have access to and to inspect all areas upon presentation of appropriate credentials, without advance notice or a search warrant. This includes any property, facility, operation or activity governed by the Oil and Gas Act, the Oil and Gas Conservation Law, the Coal and Gas Resource Coordination Act and other statutes applicable to oil and gas activities administered by the Department. The authorization and consent shall include consent to the Department to collect samples of wastewaters or gases, to take photographs, to perform measurements, surveys, and other tests, to inspect any monitoring equipment, to inspect the methods of operation and disposal, and to inspect and copy documents required by the Department to be maintained. The authorization and consent includes consent to the Department to examine books, papers, and records pertinent to any matter under investigation pursuant to the Oil and Gas Act or pertinent to a determination of whether the operator is in compliance with the above referenced statutes. This condition in no way limits any other powers granted to the Department under the Oil and Gas Act and other statutes, rules and regulations applicable to these activities as administered by the Department.

This permit does not relieve the operator from the obligation to comply with the Clean Streams Law and all statutes, rules and regulations administered by the Department.

Special Permit Conditions:

This permit is conditioned upon the well operator obtaining all appropriate approvals, including local, municipal, and zoning approvals, and any revision or modification of those approvals.

Tree cutting/trimming or other knocking or bringing down of trees shall not take place during the Northern Long-eared Bat Summer Occupancy season from April 1 - September 30.

This permit expires **05/06/2027** unless drilling is commenced on or before that date and prosecuted with due diligence.

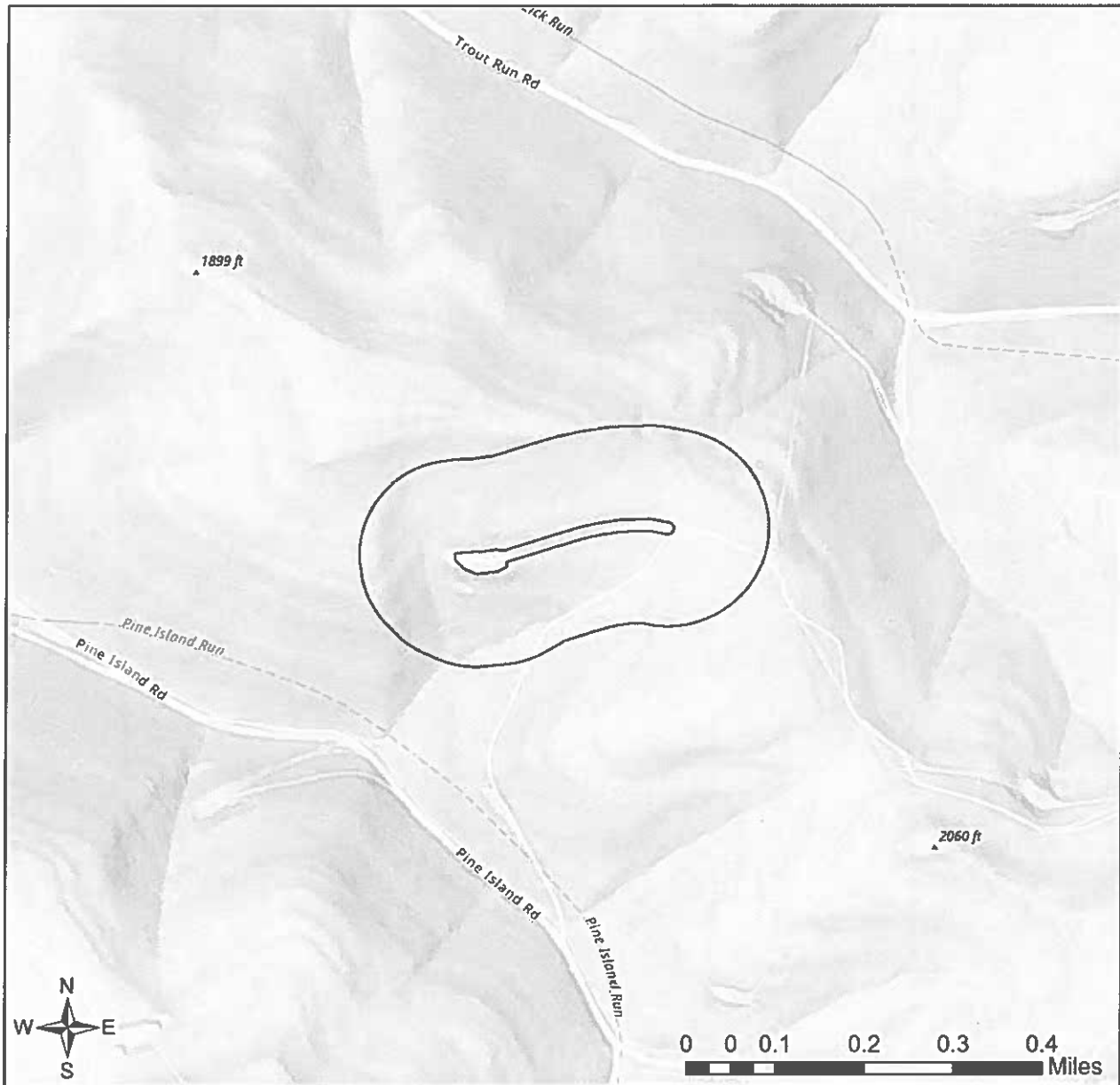

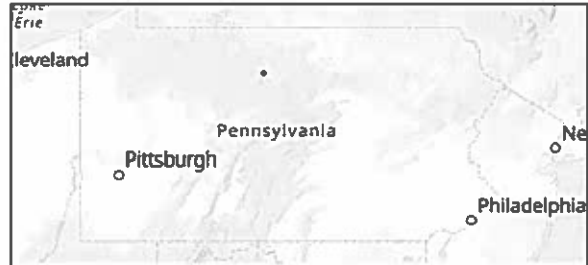

This letter records your determination using the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) system provided to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) on November 11, 2025, for 'Wharton Well - WH89' (here forward, Project). This project has been assigned Project Code 2026-0014590 and all future correspondence should clearly reference this number. **Please carefully review this letter. Your Endangered Species Act (Act) requirements may not be complete.**

Ensuring Accurate Determinations When Using IPaC

The Service developed the IPaC system and associated species' determination keys in accordance with the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (ESA; 87 Stat. 884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.) and based on a standing analysis. All information submitted by the Project proponent into IPaC must accurately represent the full scope and details of the Project.

Dear Ms. Hanes,

Thank you for your thorough review and thoughtful feedback on the CR Peters WH-89 drill-deeper application. I sincerely appreciate the time and care you took to identify deficiencies and to provide detailed, constructive guidance.

Below are my responses to each of the items you raised:

1. I support changing the application to the coordinates indicated below.
2. Attached is the completed form, but the only restriction to accommodate the PNDI hits is for all tree clearing and side limbing to occur between October 31 and April 1. Neither side-limbing nor tree clearing occurred or will occur after April 1.
 - a. The PNDI hits were for the Northern Long-Eared Bat and the Monarch Butterfly. Our 3rd party environmental consultant stated that these are not considered “species of special concern”.
 - i. While not considered species of “special concern” per the 3rd party environmental consultant used on this project, the Northern Long-Eared Bat and Monarch Butterfly were identified through the PNDI search as either threatened, endangered, or candidate species. The project location does not overlap a critical or proposed critical habitat for either species. Furthermore, NFG will avoid tree clearance and side-limbing after April 1st, 2026 to avoid potential impacts to the species listed. If the DEP would like our answer to question 4 on form 8000-PM-OOGM0076 to be “Yes” since this seems like it could be a difference in terminology, NFG is fine with this change.
 - b. Should the DEP ask us to change our answer to question 4 to “Yes”, the answers to question 4 are as follows:
 - i. PNDI search number: PNDI-850167
 - ii. PA Game Commission; U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service
 - c. Should the DEP ask us to provide a response to Question 7 on form 8000-PM-OOGM0076, please use the paragraph under 2.a.i in this email.
2. I have no issue with changing the answer to Question 7 on the permit application to

checking the box associated with “Exceptional Value watershed”. Additionally, in the line underneath the checkbox, the name of the special protection stream is Pine Island Run watershed as Barabara had indicated.

3. Page 2 of the Plat map should identify William A. Padilla, Trustee as the landowner.
4. I have attached the revised “Record of Notification” pages with the requested information.

Hello Steve,

Review of the drill deeper application for the CR Peters WH-89 yields the following deficiencies:

1. The location coordinates given on the application differ slightly from those on the plat, perhaps due to rounding errors in conversion from decimal degrees on the plat. The coordinates are within the margin of error, but I would like to update them on the application for better accuracy (decimals after the seconds, i.e., 41.19” vs 41.04” and 49.76” vs 49.68”).
2. Question 6 of the application must be answered ‘Yes’ and a Coordination Form completed because of ‘hits’ on the PNDI. Complete all appropriate sections of the form (attached) and list both agencies under Question 4 (PA Game Commission and US Fish

and Wildlife Service). Under Number 7 on the form, describe coordination with resource agencies, and potential impacts, if any. Note on the form that the PAGC Conservation Measure defers to USFWS, and for the Potential Impact to USFWS species (name species), the determination is the project is not likely to adversely affect named species.

3. Question 7 of the application is answered 'No' to this location being in a Special Protection watershed, but this location is within the Pine Island Run watershed, which has an Existing Use designation of Exceptional Value.
4. Page 2 of the plat gives Surface Landowner / Lessor as Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, which contradicts information given elsewhere.
5. On the Record of Notification pages, the upper-right block of each page must be completed with Farm Name – Well #, Applicant Name, and DEP ID #. Also, for William A. Padilla, Trustee, the box is checked for water supply, but no water supply is shown or listed on the plat.

I can update most of these on the existing application and plat, with your agreement, but please send pdf copies of the updated Record of Notification pages and the completed coordination form.
